If you've heard any of Ms. Randolph's presentations, you know what an interesting and informed presenter she is. If you haven't, you're in for a treat.





May 7 headstone cleaning at Parker Memorial






The Capt. Molly Corbin Chapter DAR asked James Alderman to train them on headstone cleaning.

They made a donation to our SCV Camp to cover the DS2 chemical cost.


